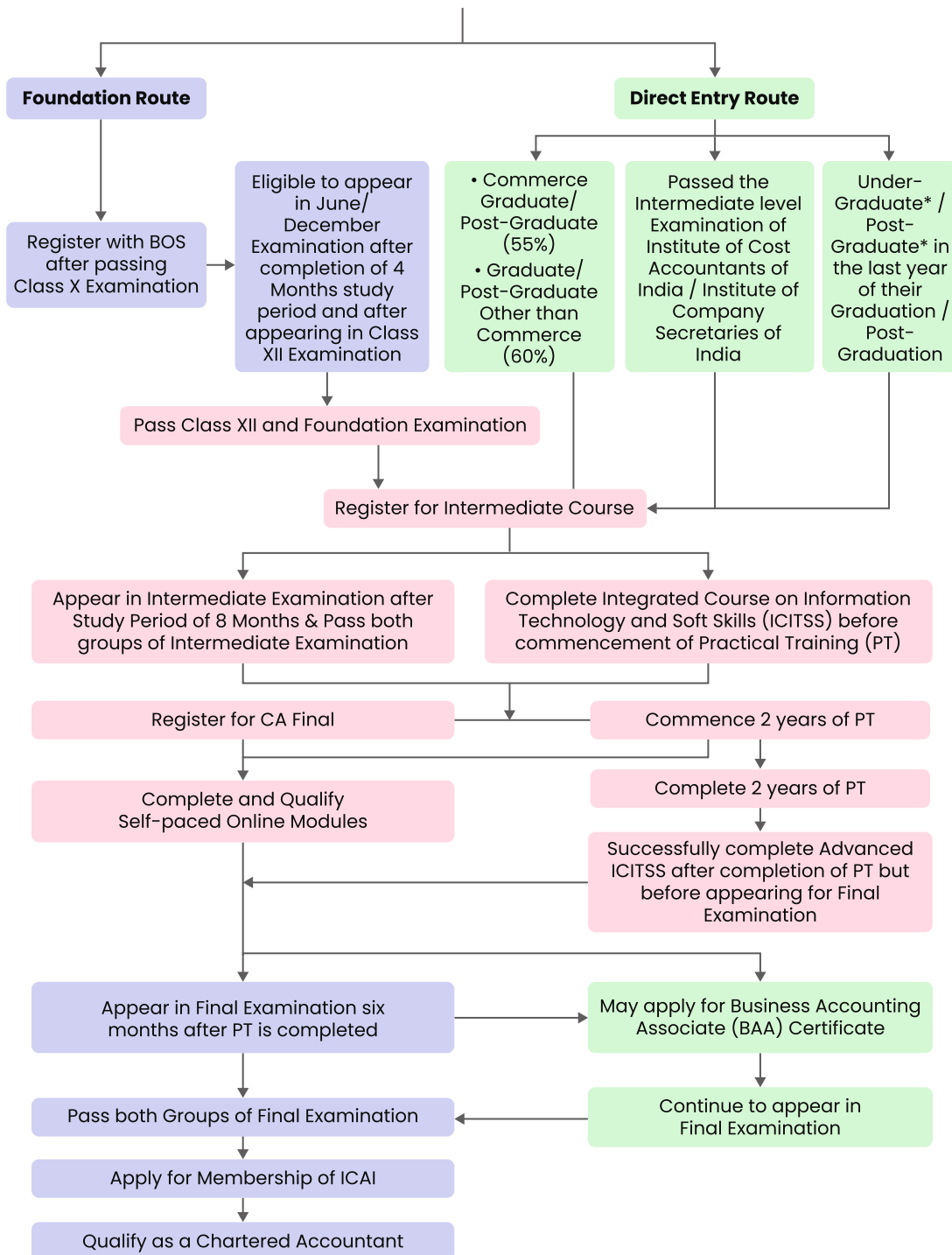

I was an extreme introvert in school and high school. I would think several times before saying anything because I had the fear of being judged or mocked.

During the covid pandemic, when we had online lectures, a teacher asked us to unmute and say 'present' rather than just downloading the attendance. I wasn't really comfortable doing that. As we had to do it, I did the same as my other peers.

After few days, a new horror had entered, An activity - Online Debate!!

I was not really ready for it.

We had around a week to prepare for the same. I could easily write speeches but delivering the same on an online mode, when I had no clue about the crowd was a bit difficult task.

So, I motivated myself “If others can, Why can't I”

And in that week, in order to develop confidence, I would unmute and ask queries to my professors rather than just posting it in the chat box. So, these small steps actually helped me to complete the activity well and gain recognition.

That day I realized that, the activity was not at all difficult, what made it seem difficult was the fear, which didn't really exist and I had just created in my mind.

No one can make us feel small and none can lift us, without our consent.

No motivational speaker or well-wisher can actually motivate us. It's always our thoughts, either motivating or demotivating us.

So it's mandatory to always get out of your comfort zone and do stuff.



People will judge today and will either forget or applaud for you tomorrow. So worrying about the society is a sheer waste of time.

In the sixth chapter of the Bhagavad Geeta, Bhagwan Shree Krishna says, “Let a man lift himself by his own self alone, and let him not lower himself, for this self alone is one's friend and this self alone is the enemy”.

This means a person should constantly analyse his own self and appreciate his strengths. Then he should try to conquer his weaker impulses by observing certain principles and values like self-restraint, endurance, detachment, abstinence and so.



IMPORTANCE OF VOICE MODULATION IN PUBLIC SPEAKING

(Speaking in flat monotonous tone) "Imagine, for a moment, a world where every speaker had a monotonous voice—a world void of emotion, expression, and connection. This is the realm of monotony, where ideas fall flat, and enthusiasm fizzles away. "

(Speaking in normal tone) I am Swapnil Fadnis from Goa and Don't worry, I am here not to torture you with my monotonous tone rather to talk on the importance of voice modulation in public speaking.

Friends, it is privilege to stand here and address you in this contest of public speaking. But back in day when my home state Goa was under the oppressive rule of Portuguese for over 450 years, we did not have this privilege. Public meeting, speeches, gatherings were not allowed by law.

In the June of 1946, when the veteran Indian freedom fighter Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia came to goa at his friend Dr. Juliao Menezes's place to take some rest, he was approached by Goans and made aware of such laws. After getting to know all this the satyagrahi inside Dr. Lohia forgot that he had come to goa for rest. He immediately planned a satyagraha by way of organising a public meeting in Margao.

Exactly 77 years ago, on 18th of June 1946, about 20000 people amidst the heavy rains gather at what is called Lohia maidan today to listen to Dr. Lohia. As soon as Dr. Lohia takes the stage, a Portuguese police officer pulls a pistol aiming Dr. Lohia. Unmoved Dr. Lohia nonchalantly pushes his arm away and says "bewakoof, socha bhi hai ki agar goli chali to kya hoga?" and then begins his address but even before he could complete his speech Dr Lohia gets arrested.

His incomplete speech was enough to light the lamp of revolution in the hearts of Goans, which later turned into a flame of revolution that spread like a wildfire. People gathered outside governor's house, police stations, jails demanding release of Dr. Lohia, they participated in the protests in heavy numbers so much so that Portuguese rulers couldn't manage the situation. Finally, they had to release Dr. Lohia, but they could not afford his presence in Goa hence they dropped him out of the borders of Goa. Not just that, but the leading freedom fighters of that time like TB Cunha, Purushottam Kakodkar, Laxmikant Bhembre were deported to Portugal to cut them off from this revolution. This is why we celebrate 18th June that is today as Goa Revolution Day. Can you imagine that an incomplete speech in the tiny state, forced the rulers who ruled goa for close to 450 years to bow down.

Such is the effect of public speaking. Public speaking is not just about conveying information. It's about conveying emotions. Power of public speaking is such that it can inspire, motivate and influence the masses. It involves connecting with the audience emotionally and that my friends cannot be done without voice modulation. in my opinion, Voice modulation is not a tool but an evidence of emotionally charged speech. Mere technical usage of voice modulation will not ensure effective communication. Rather if you speak with your heart and soul, you will find that you have used voice modulation unknowingly, because behind voice modulation there has to be emotion, not techniques.



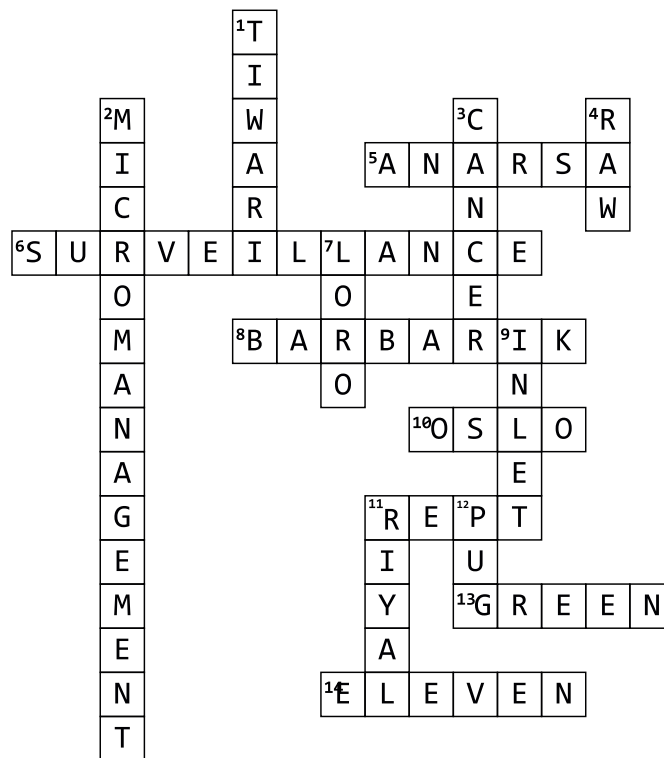
Whether it is Dr. Ram Manohar Lohia enlightening the Goan revolution, or Martin Luther King jr. uniting the nation with his "I have a dream" speech, or whether it is Lokmanya tilak inspiring the masses with his "freedom is my birth right and I shall have it"... in all the cases, emotion is the origin, speech is the medium and voice modulation is the fuel.

All this while I have been speaking about revolutions, but public speaking is not just about revolution. It is about conveying emotions, something that can be done most effectively with your voice. Not just with text. I remember listening to a beautiful Sher of Rahat Indori recited by himself and falling in love with it, but when I recited the same to a friend of mine, she didn't like it as much. I was confused as to how can a friend of mine with similar taste not like such a beautiful Sher. Then I realised, that Sher has no magic when it is read out flat. The magic lies in conveying the emotion. Which the text is not capable of. Hence instead of me reciting the Sher, I should have played the video of Rahat Saab.

I can't stress less upon how public speaking is not just about conveying information. But about conveying emotions and winning the audience. It's not about addressing the audience but about arresting the audience (pause) and guess what is the "handcuff" for such arrest?...

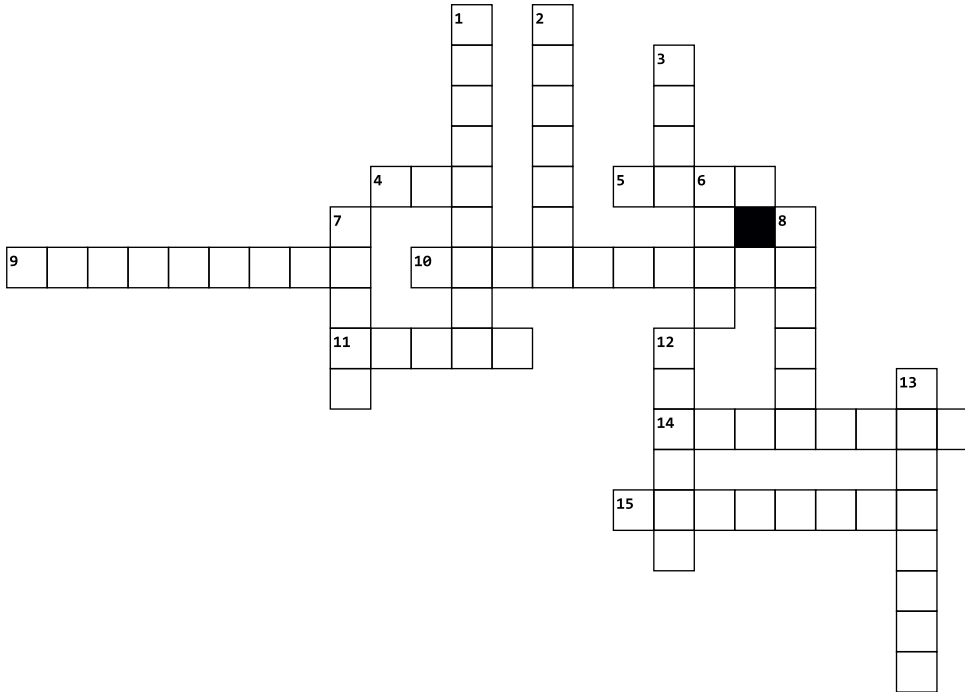
