EXTENDED PRODUCER RESPONSIBILITY (EPR)






The above concept revolves around the management of the life cycle of the product along with the Polluter Pays Principle, which essentially means that whoever pollutes the environment is liable to compensate for the damage caused. Thus the miscreant has to return the environment to its original state, irrespective of the intent.

The concept of EPR makes a producer or a manufacturer accountable for the life cycle of his product,

to downsize the waste generated by manufacturing and consuming their products and at the same time making them plan to strategise a sustainable approach, thus making them think twice before they dump their waste untreated in the environment.

These rules are not a recent occurrence. Government and Environmentalists have been campaigning and preaching the society about adopting environmentally safe practices and the importance of RRR (Reduce, Reuse and Recycle) Strategy.

As per the United Nations Industrial Development Organisation[1] Report on 'Recycling of Plastics in Indian perspective' by Dr Smita Mohanty, CPCB has estimated that in 2017-2018, India generated approximately 9.4 million TPA plastic waste which amounts to 26,000 TPD (tonnes per day).



Waste is collected and transported by authorities and is ultimately dumped in landfills. Thus, proper waste disposal, particularly of plastic and microplastic, is considerably overlooked. To counter that and address these concerns, the government has implemented the Plastic Waste Management Rules 2016, which have evolved the idea of Extended Producer Responsibility.

There is no denying that life without plastic is unimaginable right now, especially in the dearth of environmentally and economically friendly alternatives. But at the same, we are aware of the environmental threats plastic poses. Taking this into consideration, legislators have decided to cast this responsibility on the stakeholders involved in the production and consumption of plastic in the form of EPR to mitigate the adverse effects on the environment.



As per Section 9 of the PWM Rules, the entities who introduce plastic waste in the market due to their products in the form of carry bags, multi-layered packaging, plastic sheets etc., shall mandatorily register on the centralised portal developed by CPCB and shall fulfil the EPR to ensure environmentally sound management of this plastic waste. These entities are PIBO:

Producer (P): Producer is a person engaged in the manufacturing or import of carry bags or multilayered packaging or plastic sheets and includes industries using plastic sheets or covers made of plastic sheets or MLP for packaging or wrapping the commodity.

Importer (I): An importer is a person who imports and holds an IEC number unless otherwise specifically exempted.

Brand owners (BOs): Brand Owner is a person or company who sells any commodity under any registered brand label or trade mark.

Plastic Waste Processor engaged in:

(a) Recycling, (b) Waste to energy, (c) Waste to oil, and (d) Industrial composting.

PIBO are responsible to fulfil obligations for:-

- ü Recycling
- ü Use of Recycled content
- ü Reuse
- ü End of life disposal
- ü Optional engagement in collection and recovery of the plastics
- ü Submit annual returns
- ü Provide proof of certificates (Plastic credits)
- ü PIBOs can engage with PRO's or other agencies separately to fulfil their targets but reporting and responsibility to fulfil the obligations is completely of PIBO.

However, Brand Owners, which are working in micro and small scale as per the Ministry of Micro, Small & Medium Enterprises (MSME) criteria, have been allowed EPR Exemptions and have thus been kept out of the ambit of the said rule.

One needs to realise that these small and micro producers do not have the financial bandwidth, technical expertise, or capacity to cover the entire expense of waste management, let alone the total comprehensive recycling process. We must comprehend how this might make it difficult for Micro and Small units involved in plastic packing to survive in highly competitive markets and, let alone dream of entering the global market, impeding their viability. The costs for collection, sorting the waste, and then recycling it have been identified as one of the major impediments and strains on their financial budgets, thereby inflating the overall cost of their production, making these units' appeal for EPR Exemptions.



Other reasons which probably are motivating these units to appeal for EPR Exemption are the lack of resources, techniques and data available. Therefore, they may be required to hire professionals and experts who can aid them in ensuring these comprehensive guidelines. For many enterprises, the high EPR cost has become a pivotal factor influencing the sustainability of their businesses in the light of the already existing un-level playing field.

The compliance with these rigorous rules and deadlines without any logistic support makes it an arduous task for these micro and small units to adhere to the EPR Guidelines for plastic waste management. The fear of inadvertent failure to comply raises the probability of facing dire consequences in the form of pecuniary penalties, which further adds to their apprehensions and, thus, to their demands for EPR Exemptions.

By creating a roadmap for sustainable plastic packaging, these concerns of the end users and beneficiaries have to be addressed and solved. Only then can we truly reduce the disposal of untreated plastic waste and tread on the road of sustainable development. While EPR Guidelines aim to promote environmental sustainability, its application should be concerned with economic viability to ensure a seamless transition towards sustainable waste management practices in India.





ACCEPTANCE



And accept reality just as it needs to be sinked in.





It comes in different forms for all of us,

JANUARY CROSSWORD ANSWERKEY







Goa Branch of WICASA Elections – (2024 - 2025) Notice-cum-Information

The Managing Committee of Goa Branch of WICASA is composed of 2 members nominated by the managing committee of Goa Branch of WIRC and 4 persons elected by the Students of the Goa Branch of WICASA from amongst its Students. Some of the relevant rules regarding eligibility to vote, eligibility to contest for election, mode of filling nomination etc., are given below:

- 1. Any Student, who is a member of Goa Branch of WICASA as on 1st March, 2024 is eligible to vote in the election provided he continues to remain a member on the date of election. For this purpose, any student undergoing articleship training in Goa will be considered as a member of Goa Branch of WICASA.
- 2. Any Student eligible to vote in the election can contest in the election provided the unexpired period of his/her articleship training as on 1st March, 2024 is not less than one year.
- 3. A Student desiring to contest the election shall submit a nomination form duly signed by himself and by a Proposer and a Seconder, who shall be persons entitled to vote in the election. The Nomination form will be available at Goa Branch of WIRC of ICAI from Saturday, the 9th March 2024 during office hours.
- 4. Every candidate for election shall pay Rs.10/- way of Demand Draft / Cheque drawn in favour of the "Goa Branch of WIRC of ICAI" and payable at Panaji, Goa to the office of the Goa Branch of WIRC of ICAI, along with the nomination form which shall not be refundable in any case. Completed nomination form shall be accepted up to 5. pm of the 21st March 2024 at Goa Branch of WIRC of ICAI, Kamat Towers, 2nd Floor, 201/202, Patto Plaza, Panaji, Goa.
- 5. List of valid nominations will be displayed at the Notice board of Goa Branch on 23rd March 2024 by 5. pm and the last date and time for withdrawal of nomination will be 26th March 2024 by 5. pm.
- 6. The final list of Nominations will be displayed at the Notice board of Goa Branch on 28th March 2024 at 5. pm.
- 7. The election shall be by way of a poll of Students on 30th March 2024 from 10. am to 1. pm at "Goa Branch of WIRC of ICAI, Kamat Towers, 2nd Floor, 201/202, Patto Plaza, Panaji, Goa. No proxy will be allowed.
- 8. The names of all candidates elected shall be announced at the meeting by the Election Officer and his decision and declaration shall be final.
- 9. Students are requested to bring along their identity card/ copy of letter of articleship Registration/ Eligibility form duly signed by the Principle as a proof of their eligibility to vote. Ballot paper will not be issued to any student unless the eligibility form is complete in all respects and appropriate photographic identification is available.
- 10. CA. Sandesh Prabhukhanolkar has been appointed to receive, scrutinize, and finalize the nominations and to conduct the election.
